Insider Threats in a World of Externalities by Dr. Jay Kennedy

Insiders have legitimate access to knowledge/information to complete their business tasks. However, this access can easily be turned into a veil that uses legitimate tasks and activities to mask illicit behaviors. This session will focus on behavioral and organizational risk mitigation strategies that can be implemented, or championed, by IT security professionals. As such, the goals of my presentation are to:

- 1) Elucidate the scope and scale of insider threats;
- 2) Identify processes and procedures designed to mitigate those threats; and
- 3) Discuss the behavioral implications of technology-based crime prevention techniques.
