Cybersecurity Fundamentals Certificate Exam Now Being Offered

The Cybersecurity Fundamentals Certificate exam, which is geared toward anyone interested in pursuing a career in cybersecurity, can be taken online. The certificate aligns with the US National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) National Initiative for Cybersecurity Education (NICE) and the Skills Framework for the Information Age (SFIA). To earn the certificate, you must pass the exam and agree to adhere to ISACA's Code of Professional Ethics. ISACA has created the [Cybersecurity Fundamentals Study Guide](#) to help learners prepare for the exam.

Certification Update

The 2015 renewal year is underway. Remember that completing the 2015 certification renewal requires payment of the annual maintenance fee and reporting the appropriate continuing professional education (CPE) hours earned in 2014. All ISACA CPE certification policies require earning at least 120 CPE hours over a 3-year cycle and a minimum of 20 CPE hours in each cycle year. Please be reminded that certified individuals have until 31 December 2014 to earn any needed CPE to complete their annual or 3-year requirement.

Registration for the June 2015 CISA, CISM, CGEIT and CRISC exams is now open on the [Exam Registration](#) page of the ISACA web site. ISACA is proud to announce that, with the support of the respective chapters, the CISA exam will be offered in Turkish and the CRISC exam will be offered in Spanish beginning in June 2015.
